About PGA TOUR Champions

PGA TOUR Champions is a membership organization of professional golfers age 50 and older, including 34 members of the World Golf Hall of Fame. The Tour's mission is to provide financial opportunities for its players, entertain and inspire its fans, deliver substantial value to its partners, create outlets for volunteers to give back and generate significant charitable and economic impact in tournament communities. All events are televised in the United States, with most receiving complete coverage on GOLF Channel, the exclusive cable-television partner of PGA TOUR Champions. Tournament programming is available via 20-plus TV linear partners in 170-plus countries and territories, with 25 channels carrying long-form and/or highlights coverage, and 170-plus hours of live coverage distributed in 130-plus countries and territories. Programming is also available via the OTT platform GOLFTV powered by PGA TOUR in every market outside of the United States (240-plus countries and territories), excluding China, Korea and Russia, with live coverage distributed in 130-plus countries and territories.

Charity

Each PGA TOUR tournament provides individuals an opportunity to give back to the community in one of three ways – attending an event, volunteering, or donating money. Virtually all tournaments are organized as non-profit organizations to maximize charitable giving, and to date, tournaments across all Tours have generated more than \$3.37 billion. The charitable total, which includes a record \$173 million in 2021, includes donations made by tournaments on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, Korn Ferry Tour, PGA TOUR Latinoamérica and PGA TOUR Canada.

2022 Schedule

Featuring 27 events, the 2022 season will welcome one new tournament, the ClubCorp Classic in Irving, Texas, and visit a total of 20 U.S. states and two international countries (Scotland and Canada). Players will compete for over \$62 million in total prize money, the highest in PGA TOUR Champions' 42-season history.

The 2022 schedule includes five major championships:

Charles Schwab Cup

The 24-event regular season will lead into the sixth-annual Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs, which begins at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic (54-hole event with a field of 72 players) in Richmond, Virginia, followed by the TimberTech Championship (54-hole event with a field size of 54 players) in Boca Raton, Florida. The three-tournament series will conclude at Phoenix Country Club at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship (72-hole event with a field of 36) on Sunday, November 13, 2022.

At the start of the playoffs, each player's regular-season money total will become the equivalent number of points (e.g. \$300,000 equals 300,000 points). During the three Playoffs events, each dollar earned is worth two points, and those points will be added to a player's regular-season point total. The player with the most points at the conclusion of the Charles Schwab Cup Championship will win the season-long Charles Schwab Cup title.

The Charles Schwab Cup offers \$2.1 million in annuity bonus money to the top-five finishers at season's end. The prize money for the annuity will be distributed over 10 years. The winner of the season-long Charles Schwab Cup will be awarded a \$1 million annuity and the 2nd – 5th place finishers will receive annuities of \$500,000, \$300,000, \$200,000, and \$100,000, respectively.

Rookies

For players to become eligible to compete for PGA TOUR Champions events they must turn 50 years of age by the first competition round. If a player plays less than six tournaments in his first season of eligibility, he is considered a rookie the following season. Players with at least one PGA TOUR career victory who will become eligible during the 2022 season include:

- David Duval (November 9, 2021)
- Brian Gay (December 14, 2021)
- Y.E. Yang (January 15, 2022)
- Justin Leonard (June 15, 2022)
- Notah Begay III (September 14, 2022)
